Report from Finance Group (Margaret McGrath)

The management of the parish finances and other administrative issues was formalised last year by the establishment of the Parish Finance Committee. This followed receipt of guidance from the Diocese of Motherwell on the roles and responsibilities of the Committee.

It is a consultative body established to help and advise the Parish Priest in the administration of the goods of the parish. The committee has a role in a number of functions undertaken in the Parish, specifically in relation to:

Terms and conditions of lay employees

Health and safety issues including security

Due diligence in managing all parish assets

Setting an annual budget, monitoring income and expenditure against it

Ensuring full and proper books of accounts are kept in accordance with Diocesan procedures.

The committee meets every three months. Our next meeting will be held on Monday 4th September. All terms and conditions of lay employees have been reviewed. Deacon MacMillan takes the lead on Health and Safety issues and has undertaken risk assessments or cleaning materials used in the church. Paul MacNeill is our link with Church refurbishment Steering Committee and leads a small team looking after ongoing maintenance of the church and house. The committee is monitoring our ongoing income and expenditure and will continue to keep parishioners informed. The Committee will also discuss plans for repayment of our loan from the Diocese. Details of our debt commitments were published in 2017 and made available to all parishioners. At three monthly intervals details of our debt repayments are published in the Bulletin and on a Thermometer in the porch.

Agenda and Minutes of all meetings are published on the parish website.

SSVP

Ten members are active. We meet every Monday in the Parish House with Fr Pat.

We work in the Foodbank to offer our donations to those who have no referral to Foodbank, and to those who turn up at Parish House.

Furniture is stored in containers. A bus has been donated, for use both in furniture delivery and transport to Mass with a wheel chair accessible lift.

The Christmas gift tree gave 180 gifts around the Deanery. The Christmas lunch for 150 people was supported by Bookers, Marinis, Campbells the Butchers, and Weightwatchers. A special thanks to McDonalds in Dalmarnock Road who supplied 80 Happy Meals.

We have six weeks in our caravans at Seton Sands for holidays for families.

Our Mass in the Church for Sick was on June 17th at 12:00 noon and was very well attended. Lunch afterwards in the hall was provided by the hall staff and was much appreciated.

Schools are visited to explain the work of the society. Primary school had a food collection for SSVP. We also have a separate deanery fund for uniforms and trips.

A Mini Vinnies group has been set up in St. Columbkilles Primary school and is being run by two of the parents.

We run the bus to 12 noon mass for an average 15-20 people.

We plan to provide lunch in the hall on two days of the October school holidays so that particularly free meals recipients do not go the whole week without.

Evening licensed and unlicensed lets are supported by several volunteer staff. We have four personal licence holders trained. We aim to have corporate hospitality at Christmas with food provided by The Bistro and entertainment by professional performers.

Restoration of statues

Concerns were expressed about the removal of statues of our Lady of Lourdes and of crib figures following the renovation.

A second collection to fund statues for a crib was proposed. This has been rejected by the parish finance committee due to the size of our current debt which we have a duty to repay (30/08/2017).

These statues were beyond repair. The beauty of the side altars was emphasised, and people encouraged to pray here.
