

THE POPE FRANCIS FAITH AWARD









The Pope Francis FAITH AWARD is an award of the Bishops' Conference Scotland, designed to help children to show "signs of love" in their daily lives and to be active members of their local Church. It invites young people at the Primary 6 and 7 stages to use the Gifts of the Holy Spirit and to see how they can bear fruit in their homes, schools and parishes. It is directly connected to what young people are learning about the Sacrament of Confirmation. The award is open to all Catholic Primary schools and parishes, normally involving children across the years of Primary 6 & Primary 7.

If you enrol for the Pope Francis Faith Award, there are three main activities for you .

- 1. At various points, mainly across P6 & P7, you will gather together with others enrolled for the award to reflect on a short Scripture passage which allow you to LEARN and REFLECT about your Faith.
- 2. After you reflect on each Gift of the Holy Spirit you will be asked to ACT by choosing a Faith Action which you will do at HOME, in SCHOOL and, in the PARISH.
- 3. You will note your learning, you actions and your reflections on these in your personal FAITH Journal which will act as a scrapbook for collecting evidence notes, photographs etc.

To be presented with the award you must present evidence to show that you:

- have used all the gifts of the Holy Spirit when showing love of God and love of others
- have reflected on how your actions have made an impact on your journey of faith.

To gain the award with a Parish Commendation, the parish must confirm that you are participating in the life of the Parish.

ALTAR SERVERS

Servers have a special ministry in the Church. It is their privilege to assist the Priest at the Altar. Servers not only serve Mass, but also make themselves available for other services.

The role of the Altar Server is very important because he/she is one of the closest persons to the Altar and to the Priest representing Jesus Christ during the celebration of the Holy Mass and the administration of the Sacraments.

Being an Altar Server also provides an opportunity to meet new friends. Our Servers meet every month for training and also enjoy social activities throughout the year.

Younger Altar Servers meet every first Monday of the month at 6.00pm to learn how to perform their functions in a correct and orderly manner. The next meeting will be Monday 3rd September at 6.00pm in the Chapel House. Training will be given to new servers at this time.

PASSKEEPERS

The Parish provides daily Masses from Monday to Friday as well as morning Mass and Evening Vigil Mass on Saturday and four Masses every Sunday. One important part of our service to the Lord is to contribute to the celebration of Mass through serving as a **Passkeeper**.

We are fortunate to have a small group of volunteers who assist the clergy and our parish as a whole by welcoming, directing and assisting parishioners and visitors at each Mass, thus ensuring that services run smoothly. They also provide practical support by ensuring that Offertory collections are undertaken, that any necessary materials e.g. weekly bulletins, hymns books and leaflets are distributed and collected. They are also mindful of the security of our Church and the wellbeing of parishioners and guests during and after services.

Our Passkeepers are few in number and it would be helpful to have a greater number available to help either daily, weekly or on special occasions and additional services throughout the year. **Anyone of any age can be a Passkeeper**. It would be so good to have a school children involved in this.
