

Patrick A. Hennessy was born in rural Ireland, son of David & Bridget and brother to four sisters. After school, he attended seminary at St John's College, Waterford. He also studied for a degree through the Open University.

Some parishioners are struggling to accept that 50 years have passed since Fr Pat first arrived in St Columbkille's. From 1974 he served in St James', Coatbridge before teaching in our national Seminaries, firstly in St Vincent's, Langbank in 1977 and then in Blairs College, Aberdeen from 1978 to 1986. He moved to St Anne's, Hamilton until 1988 when he finally achieved his ambition of serving the missionary Church in Peru from 1989 to 1999.

In 1999 he returned to the Diocese of Motherwell, serving as Parish Priest of St Vincent de Paul, East Kilbride for 11 years before returning to St Columbkille's in 2010. He led the parish through the challenging process of refurbishment (external and internal). The result is the restoration of the Church building as a beautiful sacred space, suitable for the celebration of holy liturgy, welcoming for all to meet for prayer.

Fr Pat has often used the phrase "the conductor of the orchestra" to describe his role as the Parish Priest. This conveys something of his continuing efforts to build up our parish community by involving as many people as possible in serving the Lord in ways that use their talents to the full. We thank God for his fifty years of priestly ministry and we wish him many more happy years of happiness, good health and service to the Lord.

In 2011 he entered seminary life in Rome with studies in Philosophy and Theology at the University of St Thomas Aquinas.
