IMPORTANT NEWS ABOUT COVID-19

HOW HAS COVID-19 AFFECTED THE PARISH?

Since the church was closed on 19th March, our parish community has not been able to function as normal. Sadly, some of our parishioners have suffered ill-health and bereavement without the comfort of having access to Mass and the sacraments. While many have been placed on furlough from employment, others have been working in the front-line as doctors, nurses, pharmacists, care providers, teachers, social workers, shop workers, transport workers etc. An umbrella group, *Camglen Covid Support*, with staff from South Lanarkshire Council, the Foodbank, Healthy & Happy and our parish SVDP have been distributing food and other assistance, using the Parish Hall as a distribution base.

HOW HAS IT AFFECTED CHURCH SERVICES?

At this time, <u>and until further notice</u>, as part of the enforced health restrictions on social gatherings, all churches in Scotland are closed to the public. Our Priests are only allowed to celebrate Mass in private. Funeral services are being conducted in cemeteries and crematoria and are restricted to immediate family members.

WHEN WILL THE CHURCH RE-OPEN?

We are waiting on guidance from the Bishops of Scotland who are being advised by two working groups formed in response to the pandemic. In collaboration with the Scottish Government, the Bishops will offer clear guidance on WHEN and HOW churches may re-open. Our parish will follow the directions issued by Bishop Toal.

WHAT CHANGES ARE WE LIKELY TO SEE?

It is too early to anticipate what restrictions will remain when the church re-opens. However, with social distancing likely to be with us for a very long time, we will all have to adapt to some new arrangements. We will keep you informed of any changes as information becomes available.

HOW CAN WE PREPARE FOR THESE CHANGES?

It is clear that we will need the services of a significant number of **VOLUNTEERS**: some who can help with the cleaning and sanitisation of the church and others who can act as stewards to direct people in and out of the church. Before the church reopens, these volunteers will be given training to ensure that the necessary health and safety requirements are being met.

HOW CAN I VOLUNTEER?

We respectfully ask that no one who is in any 'vulnerable' group should offer to be a volunteer. *This is VITAL if we are to protect everyone.*
