OUR PARISH LIVING WITH COVID-19

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN CHURCH SERVICES?

Shortly after the church was closed, we obtained some equipment which has enabled us to "live-stream" daily Mass. Many have expressed their appreciation of this facility which helps them to stay in touch with the parish community. We have also been able to live-stream the Praying of the Rosary on Monday evenings in May.

The audiences for these come from other parts of Scotland, the UK and abroad. If you have internet access at home, on a phone, iPad, laptop or PC, you can use the links provided on our website and Facebook page to join our daily Mass.

The resulting increased traffic on our social media and website pages has underlined the value of using technology to encourage wider participation - not only by our own parishioners, but by some who may never have visited our church or any Catholic church. It has also been of benefit to some suffering from dementia who are able to recognise our church and to recollected fond memories.

So, as we prepare to re-open, we are reflecting on how we might develop the use of live-streamed Masses to meet the needs of those who will not be able to attend Mass physically in the near future.

We are mindful that not everyone is able to participate in daily Mass on-line. We wish to find ways of helping everyone to keep in touch with the parish community. Any suggestions?

WHEN WILL THE CHURCH RE-OPEN?

The latest Scottish Government plans tell us that in *Phase 1*, which will begin on 28th May, churches will remain closed. When we enter *Phase 2*, we will be able to open for private prayer and *Phase 3* will allow for some church services to resume with limited numbers able to attend. *Phase 4* - likely to be some months away yet - should see a return to 'unrestricted' church services.

However, all phases require us to demonstrate that we can ensure both social distancing and good hygiene/sanitisation measures inside the church building. It may be that when and how we come to church for private prayer and Mass will have to be very different from what we have been used to. This is the reality which we are all facing. It should cause us to stop and reflect on our priorities in life and to consider how we can continue to embrace our faith in the months ahead.



WHAT CHANGES WILL WE SEE IN CHURCH?

The photograph above illustrates that you should expect to see a number of different arrangements. We will be required to change: opening times, limited numbers allowed to enter the building, oneway entry & exit routes, restricted seating. Prior to re-opening, we shall provide you with clear advice on how to prepare for coming to church and how to keep safe when you are here.

CAN WE FIND ENOUGH VOLUNTEERS TO RE-OPEN?

We are grateful to those who have volunteered to help with the sanitisation of the church and to direct people in and out of the church. But we will need more volunteers before we are allowed to reopen. NB. We respectfully ask that no one who is in any 'vulnerable' group should offer to be a volunteer.
