EMBRACING THE LORD IN ORDER TO EMBRACE HOPE

7th June 2020

EMBRACING THE LORD

Pope Francis, in his extraordinary Urbi et Orbi Blessing given at the door of a deserted St Peter's Basilica on 27th March, offered these words of hope: "In the midst of isolation when we are suffering from a lack of tenderness and chances to meet up, and we experience the loss of so many things, let us once again listen to the proclamation that saves us: he is risen and is living by our side. The Lord asks us from his cross to rediscover the life that awaits us, to look towards those who look to us, to strengthen, recognize and foster the grace that lives within us. ... Embracing the Lord in order to embrace hope: that is the strength of faith, which frees us from fear and gives us hope."

As we near the day when we can visit the church once again, let us continue to be strong in faith, free from fear and filled with hope.

WHEN CAN WE RETURN TO CHURCH?

In a <u>Pastoral Letter</u>, the Bishops have expressed their closeness to those who have been grieving or unwell or anxious during these past months. They assure us that the guidance they have now given to parishes is designed to make churches safe spaces which can open up <u>gradually</u>, in alignment with the phases set out by the Scottish Government.

For now, all Churches remain closed and there is a continuing dispensation from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass.

In *Phase 2*, the Church will open for limited times of private prayer on specified days. (Details to follow.) There will be no public Mass until *Phase 3*.

WHAT SAFETY MEASURES WILL BE IN PLACE?

You are asked to consider your own health before visiting the church. If you are in a vulnerable group or shielding, you should NOT go out to church.

- You should arrive early and you may need to be patient as people enter the church.
- You must wear a face-covering.
- You must sanitise your hands when you enter and before you leave (hand-gel will be available).
- You must observe the 2m distance from others.
- You must follow the directions of stewards as you enter, go to designated rows of seats and leave.
- The toilets in the church will NOT be in operation until further notice.
- No leaflets or booklets will be available.
- The church will be sanitised after each opening.
- These measures are designed to keep us all safe.

HOW WILL MASS BE DIFFERENT?

When Mass is able to be celebrated, the normal liturgy will be followed as far as possible. However, it is likely that there will be no choral singing, no processions and no one on the sanctuary apart from the Celebrant. We will all have to adjust to these strange circumstances and new 'rules'. As we get nearer to *Phase 3*, we shall provide more details.

WHAT CAN BE DONE NOW?

A small team have been making early preparations to source cleaning material, sanitising gel etc. We are preparing the signage needed for a one-way system in and out of church. Our most immediate task is to recruit enough volunteers as stewards.

CAN WE FIND ENOUGH VOLUNTEERS TO RE-OPEN?

We are most grateful to all those who have volunteered so far, but we will need more volunteers before we are allowed to re-open. We want to have sufficient numbers to be able to assign volunteers to duty rotas sparingly. If you are over 70, or in poor health, please do not sign up. Details of an online briefing session for volunteers will be emailed to volunteers shortly.
