Our thanks go to the Welcome Volunteers who have given their time and expertise to undertake training for this task, and particularly for the manner in which they assisted everyone. Thanks also to our specialist cleaning group for sanitising the church after each session.

KEY POINTS FOR YOU TO CONSIDER

- Carefully consider your own health to decide when it is safe to return to church.
- You **MUST** wear a face covering (not required for children under 5).
- You **MUST** use a hand sanitiser when you enter and exit the church.
- Please observe 2 metre distancing spaces on the floor and the pews.
- You will be directed to a particular seat. Please follow the stewards' directions.
- On entering and exiting you must avoid crossing over other people.
- You must exit by the side doors.
- The church will be sanitised after each time of opening.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN NEXT?

We are planning ahead for the time when the public celebration of Mass can resume. It is likely that, with the restricted capacity of the church, places at any Sunday Mass will have to be "booked" in advance. We will provide details of how this can be done.
