SAINT OF THE WEEK

Welcome to our new section of the bulletin! Each week we will focus on a saint whose feast day is coming up in the following week and it seems very fitting to start with St Bernard!

ST BERNARD OF CLAIRVAUX (1090 – 1153) – Feast day: Thursday 20th August

St Bernard was a French Abbott and Mystic who lived in the 12th Century. A few years after his mother died St Bernard became a Cistercian monk. When St Bernard decided to become a monk, he was so enthusiastic about his vocation that he convinced his father, 5 brothers and 30 of his friends to join him! St Bernard was highly intelligent, extremely pious and lived a life of great austerity. He founded his own monastery in Clairvaux. St Bernard was an eloquent preacher and accomplished theologian and as such was adviser to many Popes helping to heal schisms in the church that had developed at the time. He is a Doctor of the Church and the patron saint of candlemakers, Cistercians, beekeepers, Knights Templar to name just a few of his patronages!

Devotion to the Shoulder Wound of Christ

It is related in St Bernard's annals, that in a conversation with Our Lord, St Bernard asked, which was his greatest unrecorded suffering. Our Lord answered 'I had on My Shoulder, while I bore My Cross on the Way of Sorrows, a grievous Wound, which was more painful than others and which is not recorded by men. Honour this wound with your devotion and I will grant whatsoever you do ask through its virtue and merit. And in regard to all those who shall venerate this wound, I will remit to them all their venial sins and will no longer remember their mortal sins.

Prayer to the Shoulder Wound of Christ

O loving Jesus, meek Lamb of God, I miserable sinner, salute and worship the most Sacred Wound of Your Shoulder on which You did bear Your heavy Cross, which so tore Your flesh and laid bare Your Bones as to inflict on You anguish greater than any other wound of Your Most Blessed Body. I adore You, O Jesus most sorrowful: I praise and glorify You and give You thanks for this most sacred and painful Wound, beseeching You by that exceeding pain and by the crushing burden of Your heavy Cross to be merciful to me, a sinner, to forgive me all my mortal and venial sins and lead me on towards Heaven along the Way of Your Cross. Amen
