3. the NAME of each person attending 4. a PHONE NUMBER so that we can confirm. Bookings for the next weekend can be made from Monday 9am until Saturday 10am. Noone can be admitted to church for Sunday Mass unless they have reserved a place (maximum of 50).

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST MONICA (331-387) Feast day: Thursday 27th August

Patron saint of wives, mothers, conversions, alcoholics and abuse victims

All mums worry, it's part of the job description!!! St Monica was no exception. Even though her son, Augustine, went on to become one of the great saints of the church he caused her no end of worry and heartache.

Monica, was a Christian who lived in North Africa during the fourth century. She was married to a pagan man called Patritius, who was prone to violent tempers, often directed towards Monica. Her patience and kindness in the face of this abuse and her prayers for Patritius eventually led to him converting to Christianity.

Monica is well known for being the mother of St Augustine. When he was a boy, she taught him about Jesus. As he grew up, he rejected the faith his mum had taught him and made life choices that Monica was



extremely unhappy about, mainly living an immoral life and joining a religious group called the Manicheans. She was so angry with him that she threw him out the house! But she never stopped praying for him, worrying about him and loving him.

When they moved to Milan, Monica introduced Augustine to the bishop of Milan, St Ambrose, who became a great influence on Augustine and finally opened his heart to God. It was St Ambrose who officially baptised Augustine as an adult, as was the practise in those days. St Monica was overjoyed that her prayers had finally been answered...it had taken 17 years! She had been praying for her son for a long, long time but she never gave up hope that God would hear and answer her prayers.

St Monica died shortly after Augustine embraced his faith. She never lived to see him become a priest and subsequently a bishop. But that didn't matter...Monica didn't have to worry about him anymore. Her last words to St Augustine on her deathbed, were,

'Lay this body anywhere...I only ask this: that you remember me at the Lord's altar, wherever you are.'

This is the greatest gift we can give our loved ones (alive or deceased) that we remember them during the holy sacrifice of the Mass. In these days of instant gratification, St Monica is a wonderful example of the power of persistent prayer, of patience, faith and hope in God's infinite grace. He will never abandon us.

PRAYER TO ST MONICA

Exemplary mother of the great Augustine, you perseveringly pursued your wayward son not with wild threats but with prayerful cries to heaven. Intercede for all mothers in our day so that they may learn to draw their children to God. Teach them how to remain close to their children, even the prodigal sons and daughters who have sadly gone astray.
