# **SAINT OF THE WEEK**

ST PETER CLAVER (1580-1654) - Feast Day: 9th September

Patron Saint: African missions, Republic of Colombia, those in slavery

St Peter Claver was born in 1580 at Verdu, Spain. He was brought up in a close knit, loving family however tragedy struck him at the age of 13, when he lost his mother and brother within days of each other. His father sent him to study at the Jesuit College in Barcelona where Peter developed a strong devotion to Our Lady, finding in Mary the protection and comfort that he missed from his own mother.

During his studies Peter became attracted to the Jesuit way of life and at the age of 22 entered the novitiate. Peter went to Majorca to continue his studies and it was here that he befriended an elderly lay brother, Brother Alonso Rodriguez (himself now a saint). He was known for his holiness, humility and kindness and was a huge influence on many of the students, in particular Peter Claver. It was Brother Alonso who awakened in Peter a desire to work in the newly discovered West Indies.



When Peter Claver arrived in the New World, he wasn't convinced he should become a priest, having enjoyed life as a lay brother during his studies. This changed in 1615 when he was sent to Cartagena, where he was introduced to Fr Alonso de Sandoval, who ministered to the slaves arriving from Africa. Through assisting Fr Alonso in his ministry and the example he set to Peter, of proclaiming God's love to the slaves and administering the Sacraments to them, Peter was convinced that this, too, was his vocation. He was finally ordained a priest at Cartagena on 19<sup>th</sup> March 1616.

The slave trade was big business in Peter Claver's day. Enormous profits were made from this appalling, dehumanising trade and Cartagena, where Peter lived, was an important port for the distribution of slaves. It is hard for us to imagine the horrors these people suffered - tightly packed into the hold, chained together, ill-treated, with very little food or water, during a journey which lasted 2 months, terrified of what lay ahead. About a third of them never made it off the boat.

Peter would meet these slave ships as soon as they arrived. He would collect donations from families of fruit, biscuits, wine and perfume (to mask the stench in the hold). He would nurse the sick, baptise the dying and attempt to restore their dignity. Using pictures and translators he taught them about God, how much He loved them and baptised as many as he could. Throughout his 38-year long ministry he baptised over 300,000 slaves.

Towards the end of his life, Peter Claver ended up paralysed and reliant on others to care for him. Unfortunately, the slave that was asked to nurse him neglected him terribly, leaving him unwashed for days and without food or water. Peter never complained believing it was a penance for his sins. Peter died on Our Lady's birthday (also celebrated this week), 8<sup>th</sup> September 1654.

St Peter Claver has inspired many others to follow in his footsteps. The Missionary Sisters of St Peter Claver are a congregation, founded by Blessed Mary Theresa Ledochowska. They have a community of sisters in Bellshill. We pray for them that they may continue the work St Peter Claver started and for all of us that we, like St Peter Claver, may be able to see the face of Jesus in everyone we meet.
