80th ANNIVERSARY OF ST COLUMBKILLE'S CHURCH (1940 – 2020)

In Memory of David Jackson (Son of the Parish and Rutherglen historian)

This week we celebrate the 80th anniversary of the opening of the present building of St. Columbkille's Church. Unfortunately, our celebrations for this important anniversary will be somewhat more subdued than our original plans.

On December 8th 1940, the feast of The Immaculate Conception, the Solemn Blessing and Opening of the newly built St Columbkille's Church was read by his Grace, Bishop Mackintosh followed by Holy Mass with the sermon read by Bishop Toner, former Parish Priest of St Columbkille's Rutherglen.



On the 28th of December 1940, the first wedding took place in the new church. Mr Thomas Kennedy married Catherine Tonner. The Best Man was Mr William Brown and the Bridesmaid was Catherine Ryan. The newlyweds set up home at 15 Greenbank St, Rutherglen.

By 1940 the growing Catholic community in Rutherglen could no longer be accommodated in the first church. The original building, which had been completed in 1853, was located where the lawn is today. This was retained as a hall until the mid-1950s, and so, for a time, both old and new church buildings sat side by side.

To replace the original building, Jack Coia of Gillespie, Kidd and Coia was commissioned to supply a design for a church, with capacity for 1200 worshippers at a cost of £30,000. The resultant red brick structure provides a striking contrast to the stone tenements and public buildings of the Main Street.


The simplicity of the brickwork is complemented by decorative and devotional stone features. Jesus and the four evangelists are the most prominent sculpted figures on the frontage, with St Columbkille and his monk companions above the three front entrances.

Inside, the ceiling is made of Austrian oak, as is the baldacchino, which soars from the sanctuary floor towards the ceiling. The altar is made of onyx and green marble and the reredos on the back wall behind the crucifix is made of Connemara marble. The ceilings above the side altars have recently been restored back to their original glory. The paintings in the Sacred Heart Chapel depict scenes from Our Lord's Passion and are the work of Walter Pritchard, while the paintings in Our Lady's Chapel reveal moments in Our Blessed Mother's life and were created by William Crosbie. The wonderful mosaic style Stations of the Cross which have adorned the Church for many years are the work of Jessie McGeehan.

During war time, many anxious prayers were brought to this Church. In addition to family worries, parishioners feared the bombing of their new church. Parishioner, Miss Di Giacomo remembers that at aged 11, a German radio propaganda broadcaster known as Lord Haw Haw announced that the church in Rutherglen would never be opened because the Luftwaffe was going to bomb it.

The maintenance of a building of St Columbkille's size and age is challenging. The recent project between 2013 and 2016 involved substantial fabric and roof repair followed by extensive interior refurbishment. We now have a beautiful church building that we are immensely proud of and that will allow future generations to worship God in Rutherglen.

We thank God for our Church and Parish which have been built on the sacrifices of Canon Shaw and his parishioners, many of whom were poor Highlanders or Irish immigrants. May we build on their sacrifices and trust, that with God's help, the Church may be for us, as with those who have gone before us, the Gateway to Heaven.



The beautiful sanctuary lamp which hangs above the pulpit, was brought from the old church to the new. For more than 160 years this lamp has been lit to indicate the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.
