#### **CHURCH RE-OPENING**

We are delighted that our churches are finally able to open again. From Friday 26th March we can admit a maximum number of 50 people to any service. (Requiem Masses are still restricted to 20 family members only.) As before, admission to the Church from Monday to Saturday morning will be based on names being collected on arrival at the door. For all Sunday Masses, you will have to book in advance. **Until restrictions ease further, we ask everyone to be considerate of others by not booking for the same Mass every Sunday, but every second week.** Please see the end of the bulletin for a full schedule of our services from 26<sup>th</sup> March through to Easter Sunday. Please note:

- Services which will be live streamed are highlighted in RED.
- Those services marked with a \* **MUST** be booked through our online booking system. A link to Eventbrite is provided for each service.
- ONLY THOSE WITH NO INTERNET ACCESS should phone or text 07783 340539.
- Bookings for Palm Sunday will open on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March
- Bookings for Triduum & Easter Sunday will open on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> March.

**PLEASE NOTE** that for the Triduum, when advance bookings will be necessary, we ask you to book for only **TWO** of the following services:

- Holy Thursday 7pm Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday Stations & Veneration of the Cross/Solemn Passion (no kissing of the Cross)
- Holy Saturday 8pm Easter Vigil
- Easter Sunday Mass at 8am, 9am, 10.30am, 12 Noon

#### SAINT OF THE WEEK <u>ST LOUISE (1591-1660) – Feast day 15<sup>TH</sup> MARCH</u> Patron Saint –Social workers, loss of parents, people rejected by religious orders, sick people, Vincentian Service Corps, widows.

Louise was born in Picardy in France, an illegitimate child; she never knew her mother. Her father, a widower, was from the aristocratic de Marillac family and claimed her as his biological daughter. When he remarried, his new wife refused to accept Louise, so although she grew up in comfort and received a good education, Louise's home life was far from stable.

As a teenager, she felt called to be a nun and applied to the Capuchin nuns in Paris, but was refused admission, possibly because of her poor health. When she was 22, her family arranged for her to be married to Antoine Le Gras, secretary to Queen Marie. The couple were blessed with one child, Michel and Louise devoted herself to caring for her husband and son. Less than 10 years after they were married Antoine contracted a chronic illness, which eventually left him bedridden. Louise nursed him throughout his illness. During this time, she suffered from depression, as she watched her husband waste away and cared for her son, who had special needs. She was also riddled with internal doubt and guilt that she hadn't pursued her desire to become a nun. Fortunately, she had a wise and sympathetic counsellor at the time, none other than St Francis de Sales!

Louise found peace with her life choices after an experience she had at church. She recalled, "during Holy Mass...my mind was completely freed of all doubt. I was advised that I should remain with my husband and that the time would come when I would be in the position to make vows of poverty, chastity and obedience and that I would be in a small community where others would do the same."

She was shown the face of her new spiritual director and made a vow to herself that she wouldn't remarry if her husband died before her. Three years after this experience, Antoine died. Widowed and with no means of supporting herself, Louise had to move. In her new neighbourhood, she happened to meet St Vincent de Paul, who she recognised as the priest in her vision! He was somewhat reluctant to become her new confessor as he was so busy with his own mission, but they communicated through letters and the occasional meeting; Vincent helped Louise to be at peace with her life.

In 1629, Vincent invited her to become involved in his own Confraternities of Charity. Louise was delighted to accept but it soon became apparent that there was a need for organising the help they were giving. The upper classes were not best suited to tending to the poor in their own homes, they would turn up to distribute meals, clothing etc in all their finery, which caused a certain amount of tension between them and those they were trying to help! Louise found the help she needed in young, humble, country girls who had the right attitude and the energy to work with those living in extreme poverty. These girls were the beginnings of the Daughters of Charity, which was unlike other established religious communities, whose members lived a cloistered life. These girls worked in the community, serving the needs of the poor and the sick in their own homes.

Louise led the Daughters of Charity until she died, at the age of 68 by which time the Daughters of Charity had more than 40 houses in France. The nuns have always been held in high regard, who were instantly recognisable by their grey tunic and white cornette, and can be found all over the world.
