#### **CHURCH RE-OPENING**

We are delighted that our churches are finally able to open again. From Friday 26th March we can admit a maximum number of 50 people to any service. (Requiem Masses are still restricted to 20 family members only.) As before, admission to the Church from Monday to Saturday morning will be based on names being collected on arrival at the door. For all Sunday Masses, you will have to book in advance. **Until restrictions ease further, we ask everyone to be considerate of others by not booking for the same Mass every Sunday, but every second week.** Please see the end of the bulletin for a full schedule of our services from 26<sup>th</sup> March through to Easter Sunday. Please note,

- ONLY THOSE WITH NO INTERNET ACCESS should phone or text 07783 340539.
- Bookings for Palm Sunday open on Monday 22<sup>nd</sup> March
- Bookings for Triduum & Easter Sunday open on Wednesday 24<sup>th</sup> March.

**PLEASE NOTE** that for the Triduum, when advance bookings will be necessary, we ask you to book for only **TWO** of the following services:

- Holy Thursday 7pm Mass of the Lord's Supper
- Good Friday Stations of the Cross/Solemn Passion
- Holy Saturday 8pm Easter Vigil
- Easter Sunday Mass at 8am, 9am, 10.30am, 12 Noon

If spaces become available after initial bookings have been made, these will be advertised on the parish website and social media.

# **PASSIONTIDE**



As we continue our Lenten journey we enter into Passiontide, the last 2 weeks of Lent, encompassing Palm Sunday, the Triduum and culminating in the Resurrection of Our Blessed Lord on Easter Sunday.

During this time all crucifixes and statues are

covered in a purple veil to represent that Jesus was no longer able to walk openly among the people but hid himself; as revealed in John's Gospel (John 8:46–59). The images of the saints are covered because it would seem improper for the servants to appear when the Master himself is hidden. This is another stage in the process we began at the start of Lent, whereby the sanctuary is stripped of all its adornments and we remove the brass candlesticks to replace them with silver ones, which are more penitential in nature.

Palm Sunday commemorates Jesus triumphant entry into Jerusalem and marks the beginning of Holy Week. Jesus and his disciples arrived in Jerusalem to celebrate the Passover and, as was the custom, fellow pilgrims greeted the new arrivals. The crowds, who had heard of Jesus, greeted him as a king; they waved palms and spread their cloaks on the road, affording Him the honour of a conquering hero. "Hosanna to the Son of David" they shouted. What a difference a few days makes...within a week they would be shouting "crucify him." Jesus arrived in Jerusalem on a donkey, an animal associated



with peace. A king would have ridden a horse when he went to war and ridden a donkey to symbolize his arrival in peace. On Palm Sunday we still go out to meet Jesus and join the crowds celebrating His triumphant entrance into Jerusalem. Our celebration begins with a procession or solemn entrance from outside of the church, where possible. Prayers are said and the palms are blessed. (N.B. As palms are blessed, they cannot be thrown away like rubbish but should be burned).

As we move into the Triduum the liturgical celebrations are rich with symbolism. Triduum comes from the Latin word meaning 'three days,' and encompasses the three most sacred days in our Church's year. It begins at sundown on Holy Thursday, reaches a high point at the Easter Vigil and concludes on Easter Sunday. The liturgies are intended to be one continuous celebration that commemorates the passion, death and resurrection of Jesus. For this reason, Catholics are encouraged to observe the entire Triduum by attending all of the liturgies.

The stripping of the church culminates on Holy Thursday and Good Friday. On Holy Thursday the tabernacle is emptied and on Good Friday the white altar cloth is stripped away, so that all that remains is the cross and candlesticks with the candles extinguished. The Christian altar represents Christ, and the stripping of the altar reminds us how He was humiliatingly stripped of his garments. The empty altar and tabernacle help us to reflect on the emptiness of a world without Christ. This contrasts with the magnificence of the church as revealed at the Easter Vigil, when the glory of the Resurrection is reflected in the joyful decoration of the church.

Our celebrations this year will be all the more joyous given the year that we have all lived through. We give thanks to God that, this year, we will be able to celebrate Holy Week and Easter in our churches. And we pray that the doors of our churches will never remain closed to the faithful again.
