Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

I hope this finds you and your families well

When I wrote to you on 31st December 2020, I asked for your financial support for the Diocese in the year ahead, particularly in regard to the care of the clergy. A small number of people responded very generously at the time and £20,000 was donated. I thank those who made these significant contributions. SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST. AUGUSTINE OF CANTERBURY

(late 6th Century ~ 604) ~ Feast day 27th May *Patron Saint: England*

St. Augustine of Canterbury is considered to be "The Apostle of the English" and a founder of the Church in England. Nothing is known about him before Pope St. Gregory the Great assigned him the mission of spreading the Christian message to the Anglo-Saxon people of what is now England.




The inspiration for St Augustine's mission came from Pope Gregory, who encountered a slave master selling young boy slaves in the marketplace one day. Unlike most Roman slaves, these boys were fair skinned and had blonde hair. When he enquired where they were from, the reply was "Deira", an area in England. Pope Gregory either misheard or enjoyed a good pun because he replied "then they must be rescued from *Dei ira*" which in Latin means "the anger of God".

Pope Gregory entrusted the monk Augustine and 40 of his companions to evangelise the people of Deira and the island they lived on. They set off from Rome in 596. Their first attempt to travel to England ended in Augustine and his companions taking fright and returning to Rome, having only got as far as France. Since the Romans had left Northern Europe 200 years before, the area had become overrun with brigands, robbers and barbarians and was a dangerous place to be. However, Gregory persuaded the group to return and to persevere with their journey and in 597 they landed in Kent.

To their surprise, the pagan king of Kent, King Aethelberht, welcomed them, listened to what they had to say and gave permission for them to enter his capital city, Canterbury to talk to his people about Jesus. This was not what they had expected at all! The reasons for this became clear when they discovered that the king's wife, Queen Bertha was already a Christian, having converted before she married her husband. The king allowed her to practise her faith and she had a small Christian church in Canterbury. This became Augustine's base for his mission.

Within a year of Augustine arriving in England, King AEthelberht converted to Christianity and he allowed the missionaries to preach freely, giving them land to found a monastery outside the city walls. On this site, Augustine went on to build the magnificent Canterbury Cathedral. Augustine was consecrated as a bishop and converted many of the king's subjects, including thousands during Mass on Christmas Day in 597. Pope Gregory sent more missionaries in 601, among them were the saints Mellitus, Justus, and Paulinus, along with encouraging letters and gifts for the churches. They also brought with them the Pallium, a liturgical vestment worn over the chasuble by the pope, archbishops, and some bishops in the church. It is bestowed by the pope on archbishops and bishops having metropolitan jurisdiction as a symbol of their participation in papal authority. This was given to Augustine, signifying that he was now an archbishop associated with the Holy See. Before his death, Augustine consecrated Laurence of Canterbury as his successor, he is also revered as a saint.

Most of our knowledge of Augustine and the spreading of Christianity in England comes from the monk, St Bede. He lived from 673~735 and is well known as an author, teacher and scholar. His most famous work, Ecclesiastical History of the English People, documents the story of the English Church from the time of the Romans to his lifetime, and gained him the title "The Father of English History". It is through the writings of St Bede that we know the story about Pope Gregory and the young slave boys in the marketplace, the origin of the Gregorian Mission. St Bede's feast day is also celebrated this week, 25th May.
