NEW PROCEDURES FOR ATTENDING MASS AND RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

Track and Trace: Please note that at Sunday Masses we do NOT require contact details to be completed on slips of paper or via the QR code; these details have already been collected from you when you booked for Mass.

Booking for children: Please note a place at Mass MUST be booked for children aged 5 or over.

Distribution of Holy Communion: Beginning Saturday 8th May at the 4pm Vigil Mass, the arrangements for the distribution of Holy Communion will change. Communion will now take place at its traditional time during Mass. However, it will be distributed to you in your seat, with the Priest and a Eucharistic Minister moving through the pews. If you wish to receive Communion, you should KNEEL. If you can't kneel and wish to receive Communion please STAND. If, for whatever reason, you are unable to receive Communion, please put your arm across your chest. The priest will enter the row in front of you and move along the row, distributing Holy Communion. Having received the Body of Christ in your hand, you should kneel and say your own prayers of thanksgiving. The priest will return to the sanctuary for the post-Communion prayer, final blessing and dismissal. At the end of Mass the stewards will invite you to exit the church, starting from the rows at the REAR of the church. Please be patient and follow the directions to leave the church safely.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST JOHN OF AVILA (1499~1569) – Feast day 10th May Patron Saint: Andalusia, Spain, Spanish secular clergy

St John of Avila was born to a wealthy, pious couple in the Castile region of Spain. He was sent to Salamanca when he was 14 to begin a law degree but left without finishing his degree after having a profound conversion. He returned home and lived a life of austerity and prayer for 3 years, until he was persuaded to return to his studies by a Franciscan friar, who was impressed with this holy young man. John studied theology and philosophy at the University of Alcalá. While he was still a student, his parents both died and John was left as the sole



heir of a considerable fortune. He finished his studies and in 1926 was ordained a priest whereupon he sold his family home and the possessions he had inherited and gave the money to the poor.

John felt drawn to missionary work and was eager to depart for foreign lands where he could spread the Good News. While he was in Seville, awaiting departure to the Americas his preaching and catechesis skills and his unusual devotion to celebrating Mass were noted by a local priest, who mentioned him to the Archbishop of Seville. It had only been a few years since Martin Luther had broken away from the Church and Protestantism was on the rise. The Archbishop recognised that John's pastoral zeal and spirituality were much needed in his home country to halt the spread of Protestantism and after much persuasion John agreed to stay in Spain. His preaching and catechesis of adults and children across Andalusia was so successful and well received that he was known as the 'Apostle of Andalusia.' He is widely regarded as being the greatest preacher of his time.

The leaders of the Church at the time, seemed more concerned with building churches and administration than saving the souls of the faithful, which concerned John greatly. He strongly believed that the Church should be leading by example, starting with the Pope. John preached holiness in the Church from the top down and denounced wealth and vices in the aristocracy. Whilst he gained many followers, John also made enemies of those who felt their way of lives was being attacked and as a result of this he was investigated by the Inquisition in Seville in 1531, charged with exaggerating the dangers of wealth and with closing the gates of heaven to the rich. The charges were refuted and he was declared innocent and released in 1533.

Another passion of John's was the education and instruction of boys and young men, especially those studying for the priesthood. He founded several minor and major colleges, which after the Council of Trent would become seminaries, along the lines laid down by that Council. He also founded the University of Baeza, which was known for centuries for its work of training clerics and laity.

To understand how influential and inspiring John was we only have to look at the number of saints who knew him, were influenced by him and who came to him for advice and counselling. St Ignatius of Loyola, one of the founders of the Jesuits held him in high regard and tried to persuade him to join the Jesuits. Unfortunately, John died before this could happen, but many of his disciples and followers went on to become Jesuits and he is attributed with the growth of the Jesuits in Spain. St John of God and St Francis Borgia both converted after hearing him preach and St Theresa of Avila sent him her manuscript and sought his advice for her 'Autobiography'. In recognition of his teachings, writings Pope Benedict XVI named him a Doctor of the Church in 2012.

St John summed up the Christian spiritual life as "a participation in the life of the Blessed Trinity, which begins with faith in the God who is Love, is grounded in God's goodness and mercy as expressed in the merits of Christ, and is wholly guided by the Spirit." What a beautiful quote! We ask St John of Avila, to bless all of us in our own participation of the Christian spiritual life, however we may be called to live that life. In particular we ask for his prayers for the clergy of our parish and for those preparing for the priesthood.
