SUMMER SCHEDULE OF MASSES

The hall café will only be open on Sundays after morning Masses, during the month of July.


SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST PETER (1~64~68) Feast Day 29th June

Patron Saint - Many and varied incl fishermen, bakers, butchers, netmakers fever, frenzy, the Papacy, many churches, places, countries

I recently attended Fr Paul Denney's Bible Study Group, where, over the course of a few months we read the Gospel of St Mark, it was fascinating! Through the course of reading the gospel, there were many light bulb moments to stories that we are all familiar with, from hearing at Mass on Sundays. Fr Paul was able to put the gospel in its historical context of what life was like in the time of Jesus, to educate us on the Jewish faith, how the New Testament relates to the Old Testament and also to add the personal touch of who Jesus was and who other people thought he was.

St Marks' Gospel is believed, by some biblical scholars, to be Peter's account of his life with Jesus; his eyewitness account and memories of his time spent following Jesus. As we celebrate St Peter's feast day (29th June) this week, I thought I would try and share some of what we learnt about this great saint of the church and what an inspiration he can be for us all.



St Peter and his brother Andrew, along with James and his brother John, were all fishermen and were the first disciples Jesus called. Early on in the gospel we hear about how Jesus healed Peter's mother-in-law, therefore he must have been married. I wonder what his wife made of him just dropping everything to follow Jesus? If Peter was gadding about the countryside with Jesus, how was he earning a living to support his family? How did he balance his family life with his ministry with Jesus and then after the Resurrection, leaving home to travel to foreign lands to spread the Gospel? In our modern, busy 24/7 world it can be difficult to find the time needed for all aspects of our lives, invariably one area tends to suffer. St Peter would have been familiar with these struggles trying to juggle family life, his job and his calling to follow Jesus and teach the Gospel.

Peter was present throughout Jesus ministry and witnessed the miracles he performed, as well as being sent out by Jesus with the other disciples to preach repentance, cast out devils and cure sick people themselves. Peter was part of Jesus' inner circle. Along with James and John, they were his closest friends and are mentioned on multiple occasions as being the only ones who were present when an extraordinary manifestation of Jesus' power or glory occurred; the raising of Jairus' daughter, the Transfiguration and when Jesus experienced His agony in the Garden of Gethsemane.

Despite everything he had witnessed, Peter was, like so many of us, slow to understand, prone to mistakes and his actions and his words were often at odds with one another. He was impulsive in nature, which could manifest itself in moments of great faith, such as when he walked on water and declared that Jesus was the Messiah. But his impulsiveness was not always a good thing. Within minutes of his declaration that Jesus was the Messiah, Jesus had to rebuke him (so forcefully that he called him Satan!) for failing to understand God's will. How well does that mirror our own lives? We come together to celebrate Mass, to listen to God's word, be nourished by the Blessed Sacrament and then we leave the church to find ourselves gossiping about other people or going into a rage at a driver in front of us or whatever sin it may be. Like Peter, we can change so quickly.

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST PETER (1~64~68) Feast Day 29th June

Jesus knew Peter, just like he knows everyone of us. When Jesus changed Peter's name from Simon to Peter (*Cepha* in Aramaic and *Petros* in Greek, which means 'rocky') and told him he would build his church on his rock, he also knew that Peter was going to fall asleep on him in the Garden of Gethsemane, abandon him and then deny him, so heartbreakingly, before his Passion and Death. Peter was adamant in his reply to Jesus at the Last Supper that he would never abandon him, yet just a few short hours later and after everything he had seen, he couldn't even bring himself to admit to knowing Jesus to a lowly servant girl. Again, we can see ourselves mirrored in this egocentric side of St Peter's nature. How often do we break our promises to God? How often are we so full of ourselves, boldly declaring the words but failing to follow up with the actions?

Peter may have seemed at the time to be a strange choice to be the first leader of the Church and yet Jesus chose him over anyone else. Peter's encounter with the risen Jesus, on the shore of Lake Galilee changed him forever. Jesus forgave Peter for denying Him when He asked him three times to affirm that he loved Him just as he forgives each one of us whenever we go to Confession. When we fall flat on our faces, like Peter did, on many occasions, Jesus is always there to help us, to pick us up, to forgive us and most importantly to love us, despite all our faults and failings.

Peter's impulsive and egocentric nature was transformed by God's power and he became a fearless preacher, willing to put himself in harms way to preach the Gospel, ultimately giving his life for what he believed in; that Jesus Christ was the Son of God. If St Marks' Gospel is Peter's story I love that he doesn't leave out the mistakes he made, it would have been easy to gloss over them or to try and portray himself in a different way! If God can transform Peter into a rock, then He can transform us as well, as long as we open ourselves to His Grace. What an incredible comfort for all of us.



May we all be inspired by St Peter to pick ourselves up every time we fall and to fearlessly proclaim the Gospel in our daily lives. We pray for our Holy Father, Pope Francis, the successor of St Peter that he, like Peter, will win souls for the Lord Jesus.

Thank you to Fr Denney for opening up the Scriptures for all of us who attended the Bible Study, we are hopeful that he will run another one soon, needless to say it comes highly recommended!
