#### CHURCH ETIQUETTE ~ LEAVING MASS EARLY Message from Fn Mournian:

#### Message from Fr Mournian:~

Recently, I have been disappointed to see a significant number of parishioners leaving the church after receiving Communion and it reminded me of a story I once heard. There was a priest who noticed that one of his devout parishioners who attended daily Mass always left immediately after Communion. The priest had two altar boys with lighted tapers walk on either side of him as soon as he started to leave the church. When, after three days repeating this action, the somewhat flustered and embarrassed gentleman asked the priest for an explanation, he was told that since Christ was still present in him as he left the church, His presence had to be honoured by lighted candles.

Don't worry! I'm not going to start chasing after you with candles but it does serve to highlight the importance of Mass. It is the "source and summit of the Christian life." (CCC 1324) It is the representation of the one holy sacrifice of Our Lord Jesus Christ. The Eucharist is Jesus Christ himself, really, truly, and substantially present. Mass is the most important thing we do every week! Especially relevant, the Mass is one thing. It is one big long prayer. Yes, there are parts, but they all go together, and "going to Mass" means going to all of it. We're not called to simply "get communion" and leave. Thanking Jesus after receiving communion, the final prayers, and the dismissal are all essential parts of Mass! Please give Our Blessed Lord the respect and courtesy He deserves and stay for all of Mass.
