ASSISTED SUICIDE BILL ~ CALL TO ACTION

Liam M^cArthur MSP has published a bill to legalise assisted suicide in Scotland. The bill, which proposes allowing assisted suicide for those aged 16 or over who are terminally ill, mentally competent and who wish to die, will be debated and scrutinised by the Scottish Parliament in the coming months and will eventually be voted on by MSPs in a free vote (not along party lines).

The Bill refers to assisted dying, but this is a euphemistic term which doesn't accurately describe the reality. Assisted dying is already practiced by our health professionals and organisations, in the form of palliative care. An accurate term for what the Bill seeks to legalise is assisted suicide. It is a law which will allow a doctor to provide a patient with a lethal cocktail of drugs to kill themselves.

Among the dangers outlined in the briefing:

- Assisted suicide undermines efforts to provide good palliative care by providing a quick, cheap alternative.
- It undermines efforts to prevent suicide by suggesting that sometimes suicide is an appropriate response to an individual's circumstances, worries and anxieties.
- It pressurises vulnerable people, including the elderly and disabled, to end their lives prematurely through fear of being a burden on family, caregivers and the state.
- The church also points out that assisted suicide is uncontrollable.
- In every country where assisted suicide and/or euthanasia is legal, safeguards have been eroded and eligibility criteria expanded to now include people with arthritis, anorexia, autism and dementia. It has also been extended to include children.
